### **Corrosions**

**[A type of specimen preparation utilizing mass injection with a material resistant to acidic or enzymatic digestion of soft biological tissue]**

The Mütter Museum is seeking a student intern and/or volunteer to assist in the relocation, consolidation, and object record research of historical anatomical corrosions in the collections. The scope of work would include a conservation assessment and imaging of the objects and relocating them to an environmentally controlled storage area. Concurrent with the relocation the candidate will be required to update museum database with new location codes and photographic images of all objects.

Duration – 6 to 8 months (2-3) days per week; *Estimated Time*
